Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones, and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.

#### The Good News

(excerpt from CathNews)

In a town of just 200 people in WA's grain belt sits a tall, white church that seemingly has more visitors interested in its architecture than worship these days. It is one of dozens designed by architect priest Msgr John Hawes during his time in the Midwest region from 1915 to 1939. Professional decorative painter & restorer Phil Reeves is at work in St Joseph's Catholic Church in Perenjori. It is the third Hawes building Mr Reeves has worked on and said the interest in this restoration was extraordinary, given the church's location off the beaten track. Mr Reeves is working on St Joseph's thanks to a fundraising effort after Cyclone Seroja tore through the state's Midwest. But restoration and upkeep on buildings that are about 100 years old is ongoing and expensive. With 17 buildings by Msgr Hawes under the ownership of the Geraldton Diocese, attention is turning to how to guarantee their future. The John Hawes Foundation has been launched with the hope of raising funds to conserve the remaining buildings. Geraldton Diocese heritage director Robert Cross said, "The driving philosophy behind Hawes' works was what they called the arts and crafts movement, which was a reaction to 19th-century industrialisation that demeaned the work of people. We have here in the Midwest one of the most significant collections of art and craft buildings in the whole world."
