FIRST READING

SECOND READING 2 COR 4

As we have the same spirit of faith that is mentioned in scripture – I believed, therefore I spoke - we too believe and therefore we too speak, knowing that he who raised the Lord Jesus to life will raise us with Jesus in our turn, and put us by his side and you with us. You see, all this is for your benefit, so that the more grace is multiplied among people, the more thanksgiving there will be, to the glory of God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION

IN 12:31. 3

Alleluia, alleluia! The prince of this world will now be cast out, and when I am lifted up from the earth I will draw all to myself, says the Lord. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Mk 3:20-

Jesus went home with his disciples, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind. The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying, 'Beelzebul is in him,' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So he called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom cannot last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he cannot stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house. 'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies; but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never

have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.'
This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.' His mother and brothers now arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your' mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and my brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and

my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God,

that person is my brother and sister and mother.'

The Good News (excerpt from CathNews)

Handbags full of hope have been delivered to a community that's feeling a little bit forgotten. More than 160 people are living in temporary housing in the village of Wardell after Cabbage Tree Island was ravaged by floods in 2022, forcing them from their homes. In a bid to make their lives a tiny bit brighter, the parish of Jesus the Good Shepherd in Lake Macquarie began collecting donations of handbags, filled with toiletries and other treats, as a gift for the mothers on Mother's Day. It's not the first time the congregation has taken action for others. The parish craft group, and the Belmont Quirky Quilters, have supported the people of Wardell & Coraki for a number of years. Parishioner Margaret said the people there just needed someone to care about them. "It started back with the bushfires in 2019. There are a couple of Sisters of Mercy up there who became involved because they are emergency chaplains. They let me know about it and our craft group wanted to see what we could do to help and because it was coming on winter we started knitting and crocheting warm things. When the floods came through in 2022, the craft group helped again by collecting gifts for the children at Christmas. And now, it's the handbags. It's been great to see the community so supportive of our work with those who are struggling. People are very kind when they know there are people in need."
