The Good News (excerpt from CathNews)

An innovative home in regional Victoria is giving young locals with disability a springboard to launch their independence. The Ready to Launch House, run by for-purpose disability and aged organisation VMCH, is part of a suite of expanding disability services, all geared to help people with disability find and sustain employment, build life and job skills and live independently. It provides practical, real-life experiences for young people wanting to move out of home for the first time in a safe and supportive environment. The program is tailored to each resident's individual goals and needs. Housemates can stay for as little or as long as they wish until they're ready to move on. It's the first service offering of its kind, filling a vital need in the local area, with future expansion planned into Melbourne. Daniel Boschetti, aged 20, currently lives in the house. He says learning skills like budgeting, household tasks, cooking and laundry are boosting his confidence to move out on his own. "I have learnt to be more careful with buying things, trying to reduce food wastage and everything that my money needs to cover each week. I would like to get a better paying job, find a home in town or just out of town, within my budget. I'm also working hard to get my Ps." VMCH Chief Mission Officer Bridget O'Shannassy said it was exciting to see all the great things VMCH is achieving in Wangaratta, impacting many lives positively.
